What Is Speak Out London?

- Speak Out London-Diversity City is an LGBTQ+ oral history project funded by the Heritage Lottery Fund. The project grew out of community interaction.
- The project focused on recording oral histories from LGBTQ+ people and by the end of 2016 over 50 had been collected. Participants were also able to have their own material scanned and added to a virtual community archive gallery. These records have become part of a permanent LGBTQ+ oral history archive and LGBTQ+ archive (ephemera / photographs etc.)
- The permanent archive can be accessed through the Speak Out London website and on site at LMA
- The project also supported improved access through revisiting collection catalogues and creating resources. This included exploring existing collections for LGBTQ+ material and scanning it. Currently 37,000 images exist which will be added to the digital archive.






Where Did Speak Out Come From?

Clare Summerskill brought the idea of developing the oral history collection to LMA. She has published a book called Gateway to Heaven (2012) based on LGBTQ+ oral history. She also has many years of experience as a writer, actress, public speaker and activist.

Clare is also an oral historian and a lot of her work has been around gathering oral histories from the LGBTQ community and writing and performing verbatim theatre.

Working with Clare and the community groups she networks was a powerful means of developing LMA's work with LGBTQ+ people.

Training was an important part of our offer to volunteers.











After the recordings are transcribed, again by Break Out group members (or with help from the Speak Out team if required), the content of the interviews will be available for the LMA Speak Out Website (launch summer 2016) and may form part of the exhibition planned for March 2016. Break Out groups will also have created a valuable resource for themselves. Copies of the interviews will always be held at LMA for its archive, adding to a rich and growing collection of LGBTO histories.

Each Break Out group will have a presence on the Speak Out website, where scanned copies of past flyers, programmes, newsletters can also be posted if the group would like to do this.

In this way both the SPEAK OUT project at LMA and the BREAK OUT groups themselves can create their own LGBT oral history, and online digital archive.






